WHAT IS TEACH CHILDREN TO SAVE DAY?

Teach Children to Save Day is a national initiative established in 1997 by the American Bankers Association (ABA) Education Foundation as a means for the banking industry to show its support for teaching children money management skills and the value of saving money.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The University of Missouri-Kansas City Center for Economic Education will match your first-, second-, and third-grade classroom with a local banker who will teach a 45-minute lesson on the subject of savings. The banker will provide handouts, coloring books, and piggy banks for each student.

There is no charge for the teachers or students to participate.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS?

Teachers are required to remain in the classroom during the banker visit. Maximum class size for a visit is 30 students. Depending on the lesson taught, teachers may need to provide an overhead projector and screen.
