Graduate Research Assistantships

Assistantships are generally on a per year basis, beginning in August or September. Each position must be applied for individually through each department. These typically include a stipend and a 6 to 9 credit/semester tuition reimbursement. Some positions are listed on the web but many students have obtained their position by the word of mouths, so talk to students, instructors, and staff of the university.

School Counselor Tuition Reimbursement Program

The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education is offering the **School Counselor Tuition Reimbursement Program** again this year. This program is to promote certification of individuals who are interested in the field of school guidance and counseling and to obtain provisional certification. The sequence of classes that will be eligible for reimbursement begins with the summer semester and ends with the spring semester classes. The classes that qualify for reimbursement include: CPCE 502, 504, 505, 520, 530, 531 and either EDRP 510, 512 or 513. Individuals eligible to receive reimbursement **must currently hold a valid Missouri teaching Certificate** in a content area. For information, e-mail Deb Woodard (woodardd@umkc.edu).
